In your email, please include the following information:

1. Organization's name, location, staff size.
2. Brief description of your organization's mission.
3. Description of the proposed research project(s), including:
  - a. Subject matter and scope
  - b. Type of research needed (case law, internet, interviews with experts, etc.)
4. Format and size of the final project deliverable (e.g., 10 page legal memorandum, power point presentation, etc.).
5. Name and position of the person who will be supervising the student.
6. Anticipated time commitment and timeline of proposed project (hours, number of weeks during the summer).
7. Any skills or characteristics needed in an intern. For example, language fluency.
8. Ability of your organization to house the intern in-house or remotely.
