In your email, please include the following information:

1. Updated resume (as Word or PDF attachment).
2. Topic or area(s) of reproductive justice you are interested in working on. The more specific, the better! For example: shackling of pregnant prisoners during transport and delivery; abortion access for detained, undocumented women; comprehensive sex education on tribal lands; outsourcing of surrogacy abroad.
3. Constituencies that you would like to serve or focus on (e.g., elders, Asian Americans, undocumented immigrants).
4. Geographic area (city, state, or region) and/or any specific organization(s) you would like to work with, particularly organizations that do not already have an established internship program.
5. Type(s) of research (e.g., case law, statutory analysis, interviews with experts) legal memorandum, power point presentations) and writing (e.g., legal memorandum, power point presentation) that most appeals to you.
6. Anticipated time commitment and timeline of proposed project (hours, number of weeks during the summer you are available).
7. Ability to work on site or remotely.
